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Sub: Promotion Policy & Assessment Guidelines for the Students of Classes IX & XI for Academic Session 2020-21 - Reg.

In continuation of the Strengthening Assessment & Evaluation Practices and Promotion Policy of classes IX & XI with effect from the Academic Session 2019-20 issued vide order No DE.5/212/ Exam/16-17/1373-81 dated 09/10/2019, Directorate of Education, Govt. of NCT of Delhi had issued the Revised Promotion Policy for the students of classes IX & XI as a one- time measure for the Academic Session 2019-20 in view of COVID-19 Pandemic vide order No DE.5/212/Exam/2016-17/528-538 dated 19/05/2020.

The exceptional circumstances of COVID-19 Pandemic led to the closure of schools for a long period without face to face class room teaching learning activities, Directorate of Education, Govt. of NCT of Delhi has decided to extend the Revised Promotion Policy 2019-20 as a onetime measure issued vide order no DE.5/212/Exam/2016-17/528-538 dated 19/05/2020 for the students of classes IX & XI for the Academic Session 2020-21. Result would be calculated and declared on the basis of the following Promotion Rules for this session 2020-21:

(a) Promotion Rules for the Students of Class IX:

1. The provision of Rule 4(b) of Promotion Policy 2019-20 circulated vide Circular No DE.5/212/Exam/16-17/1373-81 dated 09/10/2019 will not be applicable for the session 2020-21. The said provision is quoted as under:

"The promotion is subject to the condition that a minimum of 25% of marks should be secured in each subject out of five main subjects in Annual Exam i.e. out of 60 Marks". This provision will not be applicable for the session 2020-21.

2. Result of the students will be calculated for the promotion/upgradation to the next higher class on the basis of marks obtained in the Mid Term Exam & marks of Annual Exam plus marks of Internal Assessment/Practical taken together. Passing criteria will be 33% marks in each of the five main subjects.

3. In case a student does not score 33% marks in any one language i.e. Language-1 or Language-2 (Below 33 marks out of total marks 100), third language opted and qualified (Scored 33% and above) by the student will replace either Language-1 or Language -2 only for promotion to the next higher class.
4. It is mandatory for a student that Language-3 must be qualified before appearing in class X CBSE Board Examination.
5. Skill Course subject(s) opted by the student will not replace any elective subject i.e. Maths, Natural Science, Social Science, Music, Home Science and Painting.
6. A maximum of 15 (Fifteen) grace marks may be awarded to a student to reach the minimum required 33% of marks in one or any number of subjects only for promotion to the next higher class.
7. Student who scored less than 33% marks in one or more subjects may be eligible to appear in the subject at a subsequent examination to be held within one month of declaration of the Annual Result known as the "Compartment Examination".
8. Students who are Absent/Medical/Participation in Sports/Late Admission in Mid Term Exam and also Absent/Medical in Annual Exam may be eligible to appear in Compartment Examination in any one /all the subjects.
9. A student may be allowed to appear in the Compartment Examination in one or any number of subjects.
10. Result of Compartment Examination will be declared on the basis of marks obtained by the student in Compartment Examination and the marks of Internal Assessment/Practical taken together. The student must secure 33% marks in each of the subject(s) for which he/she has taken Compartment Examination for the promotion to the next higher class.
11. No benefit of the Grace Marks will be given to the student for computing the result of Compartment Examination.
12. In case a student is unable to appear at Mid Term Examination in one or more subjects on Medical/Sport/ Late Admission, Rule 17(C) of Promotion Policy dated 09/10/2019 will be applicable. The said provision is quoted as under:

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"In case a student is unable to appear at Mid Term Examination in one or more subjects on medical ground (duly supported by a medical certificate as per circular NoDE.5/43/04/2013-14/Exam/1553-1558 dated 13/07/2015) issued by a degree holder Doctor or due to Late Admission/ Participating in National/ State/ International Games & Sports (Duly approved by DDE (Sports), the Mid Term Exam may be ignored for computation of his/her result and promotion to the next higher class at the end of the session shall be made on the basis of the Annual Examination."

(b) Promotion Rules for the Students of Class XI:

1. The following provision of Rule 11(a) of Promotion Policy 2019-20 circulated vide Circular No DE.5/212/Exam/16-17/1373-81 dated 09/10/2019 will not be applicable for the session 2020-21. The said provision is quoted as under:

"The promotion is subject to the condition that a minimum of 25% of marks should be secured in each subject out of five main subjects in Annual Exam". This provision will not be applicable for the session 2020-21.

2. The result of the students will be calculated for the promotion/upgradation to the next higher class on the basis of marks obtained in the Mid Term Exam & marks of Annual Exam and marks of Internal Assessment/Project/Practical/ASL. A student must secure at least 33% marks in each of the five main subjects excluding additional subject studied during the session (2020-21).

3. A maximum of 15 (Fifteen) grace marks may be awarded to a student to reach the minimum required 33% of marks in one or any number of subjects only for promotion to the next higher class.
4. Student who scored less than 33% marks in one or more subjects may be eligible to appear in the subject at a subsequent examination to be held within one month of declaration of the Annual Result known as the "Compartment Examination"
5. A Student who is Absent/Medical/Participation in sports/Late admission in Mid Term Exam and also Absent/Medical in Annual Exam may be eligible to appear in Compartment Examination to be conducted in the first week of July. In order to be declared "Pass" in Compartment Examination, a student must secure at least 33% marks in each of the subject(s) in which he/she has taken the Compartment Examination and in Internal Assessment/Project/Practical/ASL taken together.
6. No benefit of the Grace Marks will be given to the student for computing the result of Compartment Examination.

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
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7. A student may be allowed to appear in the Compartment Examination in one or any number of subject(s) opted by him/her.
8. In case a student is unable to appear at Mid Term Examination in one or more subjects on Medical/Sport/ Late Admission, Rule 17(C) of Promotion Policy dated 09/10/2019 will be applicable. The said provision is quoted as under:

"In case a student is unable to appear at Mid Term Examination in one or more subjects on medical ground (duly supported by a medical certificate as per circular NoDE.5/43/04/2013-14/Exam/1553-1558 dated 13/07/2015) issued by a degree holder Doctor or due to Late Admission/ Participating in National/ State/ International Games & Sports (Duly approved by DDE (Sports), the Mid Term Exam may be ignored for computation of his/her result and promotion to the next higher class at the end of the session shall be made on the basis of the Annual Examination."

All the Govt., Govt. Aided and Recognized Un-Aided Schools are directed to comply with these guidelines considering the adverse conditions of COVID-19 Pandemic leading to stress and anxiety among the students for almost the entire academic session 2020-21.

However, if a Recognized Un-Aided School desires to have criteria other than those prescribed in these guidelines, it can do so with the prior approval of the Director (Education), GNCT Delhi before declaration of the results.


