We hope that teachers will give suggestions based on their own experiences and learning's. This will add value and richness to this whole exercise.

The Central Board of Secondary Education is requested to disseminate this widely amongst all the teachers of all the CBSE affiliated schools. The CBSE may hold video conferences on priority, send to teachers WhatsApp groups being maintained at various levels for ensuring wide dissemination of this process.

The dates for uploading suggestions by teachers are 24th August to 31st August. We look forward to wide participation from schools affiliated with CBSE.
